Berlin – On demand



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Half Day Tour

Berlin is the capital city and one of 16 states of Germany, with a population nearing 4 million (a little less than New Zealand's). It is Germany's largest and second most populous city and the eighth most populous urban area in the European Union. The city enjoys a temperate seasonal climate with round one third of its territory comprising forests, parks, gardens, rivers and lakes. The city was subject to 363 air raids during WWII from 1940 to 1945 with so much damage that much of it has had to be rebuilt, often with the benefit of extraordinary architecture and urban design.

From 1945 to 1990 it was the capital of the German Democratic Republic (GDR/DDR) and a heavily subsidised outpost of the Federal Republic of Germany (FRG). Since 1990 it has reclaimed its place as German's capital.

This single page flyer is not intended to be a definitive guide to Berlin but will give interested travellers an introduction to this amazing city. The further information on our website and the complimentary guide we give to our guests provide much more detail and are an indication of our enthusiasm for the City. The photos in this flyer are a combination of historic and contemporary and are a small selection from our guide. They are intended to convey something of the city's history and what you will see when you are our guest.

Logistics

All guests are required to bring any items required for use en route, such as warm clothing, a rain jacket, water and any snack treats.

The distance cycled is very moderate being about 15 km at most. Guests will need to be reasonably fit although being part of the 'lycra brigade' is not a prerequisite! The terrain is flat. The weather is generally fine and sunny, however there are no guarantees that this will be the case! If it rains, you may get wet. There is not much we can do about the weather.
